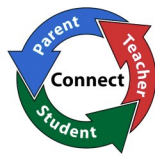
Dress for the Weather

Helping at Home



What can you do as a parent to help at home with your child's education?

Below are some suggestions of things you can do to help your child improve their skills:

Lexia Reading: Our students have Lexia Learning Core 5 available for them. The children work on this reading program at school, but can also practice on it at home. Please make sure your child is on this site at least 20 minutes per week. Your child should know/have their ID and password.

Reflex Math: Make sure that your child also practices on Reflex Math at home. This program practices basic math facts. Our goal as an elementary is to make sure all of our students have mastered their math facts by the end of fourth grade. You are important in helping us with this goal. Your child should know his/her ID and password.

Reading: Read with your child DAILY. Set up a routine where you read at a certain time of day, for example, before bedtime. Your child does not have to read every word. You can read a page, and he/she can read a page.

Check your child's bookbag NIGHTLY. Discuss with your child how his/her day was and what was learned.
